# Correspondence reviewed

Department of Municipal Affairs, Land Governance and Planning Division. The town advertised the intention to dispose of land adjacent to a property on Columbus Drive. The Department is looking for additional information. This matter is deferred until the further information has been provided.

Eastern Regional Lands Office, RE: Crown Land application for Valley Road The application submitted by the Town to Crown Lands was incomplete pending further documentation. Deferred until further information is obtained and application can be resubmitted.

## MEO Report reviewed

The MEO Report identified that here are a number of businesses operating without a permit, renovations, general repairs and new construction being carried out without a permit. MEO is following up on the properties identified and property owners are reminded that a permit is required for all development.

#### **New Business**

Committee discussed the possibility of Municipal Plan Review. Funds have been allocated in the 2020 budget for this item. A new Plan is expected to be very costly, possibly between \$40,000 - \$50,000. Committee is evaluating whether some specific amendments would be more cost efficient. Deferred for further review with the planner.

- b) Public Works, Waste Management & Community Services Councillor Dowden advised the committee met on February 26<sup>th</sup> and reviewed the following from the committee meeting:
  - Garbage collection There are still a few issues with the new garbage contractor, but it has greatly improved since the start of the year.
  - Newfoundland Power, Take Charge challenge, Deadline to apply is April 3.
    Projects must demonstrate a positive effort to conserve energy that
    benefits the entire community. The Town is considering submission for
    upgrades already completed to the depot and the pool.
  - Royal Canadian Legion, Re: Inquiry on Water Street development.
     The Legion will be hosting the Battle of the Atlantic Parade and Memorial Service on May 3<sup>rd</sup> and inquired on the status of the Water Street development project for this year. The reported funding has not been approved to date. If funding is approved, the project will have to be designed and tendered so is not likely to be started by May.

Deputy Mayor O'Grady inquired about the proposed change to the Volunteer Fire Department By-Laws. Under review and will be brought forward at the next meeting.

Councillor Doyle asked if a motion was required for the cost to replace mirror on vehicle at cost of \$883.52. CAO advised a motion is not required as the CAO can authorize purchases up to \$2,000.

c) Recreation, Special Events, Culture & Tourism
Councillor Noel advised the committee met on March 3<sup>rd</sup> and reviewed the following from the committee meeting:

- Triathlon The triathlon route is being reviewed by the Recreation Commission and the Director of Recreation will bring back recommendations from the review.
- Councillor Noel congratulated the Director of Recreation and members of the Recreation Commission for work and organization of the Recreation Commission Annual Awards Night.
- Councillro Noel congratulated the Special Events Committee for the success of the Winter Carnival.

He noted that they have a serious issue with leaky roof on the building. They are trying to determine if funding can be obtained for repairs to the roof.
- Landscape NL Horticultural Association, RE: Invitation to participate in Forgotten Corner Program Beautification Project. Deadline is March 31. The Committee is looking at possible places throughout town that would be suitable for this purpose.
- Saltwire, RE: Horizons 2020 magazine The committee reviewed this matter. There are typically two publications of this magazine: one in the spring and one in the fall. Deferred for further information to determine which the committee will recommend.
- Heritage NL, RE: Request for letter of support for provincial funding for Heritage NL. The deadline to forward a letter of support was February 14. There was a very short time frame to forward a letter of support. The correspondence will be filed.
- Selfie wall Committee is considering the possibility of a designated area to have a selfie wall constructed. Deferred until further research on the cost and location can be determined.
- Summer Programming Coordinator Museums The Town will be proceed to advertise the position of Museum Curator / Supervisor.

- Heritage Society, Re: Removal of paint on the locomotive The Committee reviewed the correspondence and has some discussion on the options for the locomotion. Further information is required before a recommendation can be made on this matter.
- Program Activity guide Staff are currently working on developing an activity guide similar to the one reviewed. The guide will be uploaded to the website once it is completed.
- Recreation Programming currently working on a variety of events to be held over the next several months such as line dancing, knitting, yoga, stained glass, etc. Ball hockey will be offered starting soon at Carbonear Academy.
- Update on pool project: Swimming Pool Liner Replacement & Washroom Accessibility & Deck resurfacing - The tender has been submitted for provincial approval.
