Whereas, lymphedema is a chronic and debilitating disease, characterized by an accumulation of lymphatic fluid that causes swelling of the arms, legs or other areas of the body and which can cause disfigurement, disabilities, discomfort, pain and distress and impair quality of life;

Whereas, patients with lymphedema may struggle with pain and swelling, may have recurring severe infection cause by lymphedema, and may experience financial and psychological strains due to the difficulties of managing their disease;

Whereas, while there are cases of primary lymphedema that are inherited, most cases are secondary that developed as a result of trauma, infection, surgery, radiation therapy or removal of lymph nodes, including cancer treatment;

Whereas, gaps in research, education and effective treatments exist, and more knowledge about lymphedema is needed to achieve timely diagnosis, management and care and to develop more effective treatments; Whereas, lymphedema is estimated to affect 2.8% of the population, or 14,600 people in the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador; Whereas, the Lymphedema Association of Newfoundland and Labrador is a registered charity, dedicated to ensuring all lymphedema patients have

a registered charity, dedicated to ensuring all lymphedema patients have access to information, support and treatment, thereby promoting healthy and hopeful living with lymphedema;

Whereas, March 6 of each year is internationally recognized as World Lymphedema Day to raise awareness about this disease and the treatment options available;

Therefore, the Town of Carbonear do hereby proclaim March 6, 2022 be observed as World Lymphedema Day in the Town of Carbonear.

Councillor Doyle asked which doors are being replaced. Director of Operations and Public Works advised the doors will be priced separately in the tender. The main entrance and the receiving door at the rear of the theatre are priority, pricing and budget will determine which ones will be completed.

Councillor O'Grady advised that the committee met on February 24th and noted the following from the meeting:

- Property of 12 Hayden Heights This was advertised for sale by tender, and there were no bids received. The CAO will research the required procedure to determine if wan can proceed to list with a realtor.
- Policies and procedure training for Council. Council met last Monday and reviewed some items. Another meeting will be scheduled to review other items such as Animal Regulations, Traffic Calming Policy, Rules of Procedures, etc.
- ➤ <u>Email Listing</u> Residents and property owners are encouraged to sign up through the link on the Town's website if they would like to be included on the town's email listing for news releases, etc.
- Replacement cost of buildings committee is looking at updating the replacement cost of our buildings as listed for insurance purposes.

Councillor Doyle declared a conflict of interest on Item 1b as this is the school where she is employed.

Deputy Mayor Slade noted that he was a member of the Legion but not an officer of the organization.

Mayor Butt noted he was a member of the Knights of Columbus and the Legion, but not an officer on either of these organizations.

Councillor O'Grady noted he is a member of the Legendary Car Club, but is not an officer of the organization.

> Fire Protection Line Road

Mayor Butt, Deputy Mayor Slade and Councillor Noel declared a conflict of interest on this matter as they or a family member have properties in Line Road.

Mayor Butt, Deputy Mayor Slade and Councillor Noel then left the meeting. Councillor Doyle assumed the position of Chair. Councillor O'Grady advised that Council has been trying for some time to get Fire Protection Fees for Line Road. They have not been paying Fire Protection fees for a number of years now while other areas have been paying for Fire Protection including Gunner's Pond area and Freshwater. The committee does not feel it is fair to recommend continuing this service to the Line Road property owners without the Line Road Association paying the same fees as other areas.

There is an agreement with ERSB for the unincorporated areas across the highway to invoice and collect the fees for Fire Protection. The ERSB will not be entering into agreements where there is no solid waste disposal collection, so they cannot provide this service to the Line Road.

Discussed.

CAO noted that Council would have to ensure they provide proper

notification if they choose to discontinue the service to the area. Committee will follow up on the legal requirements and the notice required if the town were to decide to discontinue the service in this area. Matter deferred for further information.

Mayor Butt, Deputy Mayor Slade and Councillor Noel were called back into the meeting.

Mayor Butt assumed the position of Chair.

Councillor O'Grady reminded Council of the Strategic plan meeting scheduled for 23rd of this month.

- c) Recreation, Special Events, Tourism and Culture Councillor Seymour advised that the committee met on March 1st and noted the following from the meeting:
 - The Under 20 National Softball tournament is scheduled to take place in the Town of Carbonear this year.
 - The Recreation Director is getting further information concerning possible changes to rental times and fees.

If Council has any questions on any items, please feel free to ask.

- Councillor Doyle asked if there is an update on any dates for activities for the Come Home Year activities. The EDTO noted that May 16th is the start of the activities, with the Stationer's Festival, August 20th is the Special Events Concert, the 1st weekend of August is Carbonear Days weekend which will have events throughout the weekend.
 - A notice will be put out regarding all the events. We have already received notification of various events from community groups as well.
- ➤ Deputy Mayor Slade noted that there is a plaque in the lobby for a property contest. The last winner on the plaque was in 2013. It seems as though this contest is no longer being done and he asked if it could be reactivated.
 - Councillor Doyle noted that the Special Events have had events such as this for the past 4 years. If that plaque is for the same type of event, then we can get it updated.
 - Councillor Seymour noted this is the year of the Garden. EDTO noted that the Town is participating the Communities in Bloom competition this year.
 - Councillor Seymour noted he will add this item to the next Committee agenda for further investigation.
- Councillor Doyle requested that the Committee look into whether or not we can host a triathlon this year with the lifting of Covid restrictions. She noted that this may be the 30th anniversary of the triathlon. CAO noted that the Recreation Director deals with the provincial Triathlon organization on this matter. Councillor Seymour noted he will add this item to the next Committee agenda.

- d) Economic Development, Planning and Land Use Planning Councillor Doyle advised that the committee met on March 3rd and noted the following from the meeting:
 - > There are ongoing items relating to permits.
 - ➤ There is ongoing discussion on Fence Regulations. The CAO is following up on a matter and will provide more information to clarify the issue.
 - Development applications are on the rise, and building permits should increase this year. There are several new construction development applications currently being reviewed and the sub-division of property.

CAO noted that as a discretionary use, a discretionary notice is advertised and in addition to that the Town also delivers a copy of the notice to the neighbouring property owners.

Deputy Mayor Slade asked if it is noted in the advertisement if the development is for seniors (55+) housing units.

CAO noted that the notification identifies what a person would have to do to file an objection to the application.

Deputy Mayor Slade noted that if the notice provides what type of housing units are being considered, seniors units or other type of units, this information would be helpful to those considering an objection to the development.

8. Reports of Chief Administrative Officer and Department Heads

a) CAO Report

Due to a pending sale of property in the area, the Town is being requested to provide a Deed of Confirmation/Release regarding an abandoned right of way in the Blueberry Crescent and Forest Road area confirming that "the right of way is no longer in use and/or has been extinguished and/or abandoned by the Town and is no longer dedicated for public use". This location of the abandoned right of way was reviewed with Council prior to the meeting.

If Council is in agreement, a motion of Council is required to confirm this. Councillor Noel asked if he would be in conflict of interest on this matter as he owns property on Blueberry Crescent.

Two tenders were called last week

- Service Contract for Garage Door Maintenance and Miscellaneous Work
- o Service Contract for Electrical Services Miscellaneous Work Mayor Butt asked when this was last done.

Director advised the service contract for garage door maintenance was not previously done. The electrical services was last called several years ago. CAO advised this is being done now to meet the requirements of PPA.

Deputy Mayor Slade asked about the contract for the HVAC units at the pool. If we have a contractor here in the town, it should be less expensive than someone who has to travel from outside the town. CAO advised there was a contract put in place some time ago, these will all be going out again now for bids.

CAO advised that RFPs will go out for all our service contracts. When the RFP goes out, then anyone can bid on it.

This is the whole point of the PPA. We don't know what the bids will be until the RFP goes out.

CAO noted that preference is on a provincial basis not on a municipal basis. Best value would be the priority.
Councillor Noel suggested, a master list of all service contracts should be completed. Director of Operations and Public Works advised that a listing can be completed and shared with the Public Works Committee. The details can be provided later.
