b) Administration and Finance

Councillor O'Grady advised that the committee met on May 12th and noted the following from the meeting:

- ➤ 12 Hayden Heights Should have motion after next meeting to list the property for sale through a realtor. Only one proposal was received.
- HR Policy Some changes are being made and should be recommended for adoption at next meeting.
- AR Report 2022 tax Property Tax 80%, Water/Sewer Tax 78% and Business Tax 85% collected.

Request from resident, Issue with \$25 invoice to turn water back on when returning to his residence after being gone for the winter months. This fee is included on the Town's tax structure. There are a number of residents who request to have the water turned off to their property while they are away from their property for an extended period of time. The \$25 fee is charged when the property owner requests to have the water turned back on. This fee is not charged for those who require the turn off/on to repair a water leak. Discussed.

A refund of the \$25 fee is not recommended. This item will be reviewed further for possible changes in determining the 2023 Schedule of Municipal Tax Rate and Fees during the 2023 budget preparations.

- > The position of Museum Manager should be filled in the near future.
- Inquiry from new business owner requesting a review of the rates for the category of register massage therapists.
 The initial email was responded to and it was suggested that she check with the Municipal Assessment Agency to inquire about the assessed value for the tenant portion of the building that she occupies for her business to determine if the correct area was being assessed.
 Discussed.

The business tax mill rates will be reviewed again during the 2023 budget preparations.

- c) Economic Development, Planning and Land Use Planning Councillor Doyle advised that the committee met on May 19th and noted the following from the meeting:
 - > RFP for the Municipal Plan Review is being prepared and will be posted on MERX when completed.
 - > Some Development Applications are awaiting on the deadline of the Discretionary Use Ads on the application.
 - ➤ Committee has no issue with a request to renew a permit for a second time due to a delay in commencing the work due to problems with the supply of materials during COVID.
 - Potential developments for apartment building and row housing. Deferred for additional information.
 - Business luncheon scheduled for June 10.
 - Reminder for property owners to apply for permits, patios, sheds, etc. If the original location does not comply, sometimes staff can help to determine a suitable location that complies.
