### **Important Reminders!**



Snow Clearing Regulations are in effect as of Tuesday, November 1, 2022

Vehicles are not permitted to be parked or abandoned on any street reservation between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. during a snow fall or for 12 hours after a snow fall has ceased.

Vehicle owners in violation of these regulations may be subject to a fine or having the vehicle towed at the owner's expense.

The Town of Carbonear will not take responsibility for damage to fences, garbage boxes, trees, lawns or other structures located within the street reservation.

### Garbage Collection

Residents are reminded to have their garbage and recycling placed curbside on the day of collection by 7 a.m.

A limit of 6 bags of garbage for collection.

### Tax Payments

Property owners are reminded that all Property, Water/Sewer and Business Tax for 2023 are due **February 28, 2023.** 

Interest is charged monthly at a rate of 8.5 % per annum on all overdue accounts. Payments can be made by cash, cheque, debit, online banking, at your bank machine or teller or by preauthorized payments form your bank account.

We no longer accept credit card payments directly. However, taxes may be paid by credit card via Plastiq, which will accept credit card payments on our behalf.

Please be advised that this third party provider will charge a fee for this service.

To avoid discontinuation of services for outstanding 2022 and prior taxes, please contact the town office to make satisfactory arrangements to pay the balance on your account.

### Low Income Interest Adjustment Policy

Property owners with a family income of less than \$50,000 that are paying their taxes monthly may be eligible for an interest adjustment upon completing the required application and providing necessary documentation.

#### 2023 SCHEDULE OF MUNICIPAL TAX RATES

### Property Tax

Residential Property Tax (minimum \$300 per parcel)......6.75 mills of assessed property value Commercial Property Tax (minimum \$500)......

Taxpayers with a Household Family Income of \$50,000 or less may be eligible for an interest adjustment in accordance with the Interest Adjustment Policy. Applications and the policy are available by contacting the Town Hall.

Service Organizations are eligible for a property tax adjustment in accordance with the Real Property Tax Exemption – Service Organizations Policy.

### **Carbonear Volunteer Fire Department**

The Carbonear Fire Department has noticed that many properties are lacking clear & visible house numbers. Firefighters, law enforcement & paramedics will find you faster when your home is properly marked.

Minutes or even seconds can make a difference in a life or death situation.

Points to remember:

- Use civic numbers with a contrasting background, so they will be visible.
- Civic numbers need to be at least 4 inches in height and visible under lighting at night
- The bottom of the civic numbers should be a minimum of 48 inches above grade
- The civic numbers should be displayed on the side of the building that faces towards the street upon which the street is addressed
- Be sure to keep the civic numbers visible by trimming trees and bushes.



### Budget 2023

At a Town of Carbonear Special Council Meeting held Wednesday, December 15, the 2023 Budget was presented by Finance and Administration Committee Chair, Chris O'Grady.

Councillor O'Grady stated, "We are very pleased to announce that this balanced budget will be attained without any increases in the tax rates. However, property assessment values are calculated annually by the Municipal Assessment Agency and for 2023, the overall assessments have increased by 5%. Based on this residents may see a small increase in their property tax invoice."
