- d) Report from council liaison for the P.S. NaGeira Theatre Board Councillor O'Grady provided the following information regarding the Theatre Board:
 - Theatre bookings are up from the previous year. Current year bookings have already exceeded total prior year's bookings.
 - The fundraising concert held in June was a great success and added much needed funding.

- The Eventbrite booking software has helped greatly as patrons are no longer limited to box office hours to buy tickets. This has helped increase sales.
- Bookings in the new community room are also up significantly.
 The response from groups who have booked is very positive.
 Groups are very pleased with the room as they find it spacious and bright. They also like the accessible parking and accessible washrooms.
- As of last week, there were 15 days in October with various bookings in the community room with a number of these bookings for a full day. November is booked equally as well.
- A New Horizons Grant has been applied for which would possibly allow for some instructional classes in the Arts for seniors.
- One issue which needs to be addressed is the broken stair lift going up to the stage. The building and the theatre are accessible. There is a lift from the Community room down to the stage stairs area but the lift going up to the stage area is currently not working.

Councillor O'Grady inquired about the holes and gaps on Highroad South where there was work done on the 2022 paving project. Director advised this should be addressed, he is waiting to hear back from the contractor on the matter.

It was noted that there are repairs needed on the ramp going up from Valley Road to Columbus Drive, trenches in the shoulder of the road along the edge of the asphalt. Director advised he will put a request in to Department of Transportation and Infrastructure.
