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a) Director of Recreation

The Director of Recreation reviewed the following from his report with Council. Pool & Rec Maintenance

- Outside facilities are winding down. Staff are in process of winterizing all of our outdoor facilities. Will be finishing up as of November 3rd.
- Contract to be awarded for upgrades to staffroom/washroom at pool along with a door replacement. The staff will be very pleased to see this work completed.

Financial & Program Analysis

- > Pool Revenue is up from this time last year and Recreation Revenue is significantly higher than last year.
- > There are double the participation numbers in programming which also includes the summer program.
- ➤ Lesson registration participant numbers will be updated on the next report after lesson registration.

Programs & Grants

- ➤ Halloween Dance (Youth) taking place this Friday. Registration for this event has been well received. Still some limited space available.
- ➤ Trick or Treat Trail walk taking place Saturday on Nell's Trail. Should be a great event with over 20 businesses/service groups joining us this year to help put smiles on the children's faces and maybe a friendly scare along the way!!
- ➤ Bonfire Night is scheduled to be held on Monday, November 6th. This event is being hosted by the Special Events Committee at Paddy's Garden in partnership with the Carbonear Fire Department.

Councillor Doyle asked when Council will review the Recreation Master Plan and will the consultant come back and review the plan with council. There is no presentation by the consultant to Council included in the proposal. This was distributed to Council as per the Committee, so that Council can review, and when everyone has had a chance to review the document, then Council can schedule a separate meeting to review the plan together. The consultant presented the plan to the CAO and the Director of Recreation. Councillor Seymour noted that this is a 122 page document and when Council reviews the document, then we will then determine how to proceed. Deputy Mayor Slade thanked Tract Consulting for the completion of the Recreation Master Plan.

The Recreation Director noted that Tract had the final plan done when it was mentioned in a previous council meeting and he was at that time checking to see if copies were still to be provided for Council members.

Deputy Mayor Slade apologized for any misunderstanding on the matter.

Councillor Noel noted there are many visitors to the town during sporting events for softball, skateboarding, ATV runs, etc. He looks forward to growing recreation events within the Town.

Deputy Mayor Slade thanked all the volunteers involved with these activities.

b) Chief Administrative Officer
