WHEREAS Crohn's and Colitis Canada is a national, volunteer-based, non-profit organization supporting more than 322,000 Canadians living with Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis, chronic autoimmune diseases that causes the body to attack healthy tissue, leading to inflammation of part of or all of the digestive system;

WHEREAS people living with IBD routinely endure abdominal pain, cramping, fatigue, internal bleeding and frequent and urgent bowel movements — in some cases more than 20 times a day. While more than five million people globally live with IBD, Canada has one of the highest prevalence rates in the world, with the Atlantic provinces having the highest rates in the country. By 2035, experts predict the number of Canadians living with IBD to exceed 470,000 — over one per cent of the population. Currently there is no cure for Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis:
