Is there any update on the Downtown Phase 3 Project

Deputy Mayor Slade advised the CAO met with ACOA on the matter.

CAO advised that ACOA is requesting an increase to the Town's portion for the project. She did meet with the province and ACOA. The Town advised ACOA that the Town would increase their contribution from 10% to 15% and we are looking to see if the province will increase their share as well.

Mayor Butt asked if ACOA is waiting on anything else from the Town. CAO advised, not from the Town itself, we are waiting on a response from the province. Mayor Butt asked if we could meet with ACOA to determine if they are waiting on anything else.

CAO advised she will follow up to see what the status is with the province.

CAO advised the underground work is approved. The consultant is currently working on the design including the street scape design as well.

Council inquired if any capital works projects have been approved. CAO advised all but one of the projects submitted have been rejected. The other remaining project is marked pending.

Deputy Mayor Slade noted he is surprised to see that there are no approvals on our Capital Works applications.

b) Recreation, Special Events, Culture and Tourism

Councillor Seymour advised the committee met on September 3rd.

The Committee discussed fall plans. Bothe the EDTO and Director of Recreation are proceeding with their fall plans.

Councillor Seymour thanked everyone in the town, especially our volunteers.

Councillor Doyle asked if the repairs have been made to the floor and doors in the multi-purpose room at the pool. CAO advised, the last update was that they are waiting on tiles for the repair. She will follow up with the Director of Recreation and advise Council.

Councillor Doyle noted there is a significant section of Nell's Trail on the turn where there was shale, will there be any class A added. Walking on the shale is not comfortable for trail users.

CAO advised there are plans to use crusher dust to upgrade the trail as well.
